17.3.17	Review Your Home and Vehicle Security	Residents are being urged to review car and home security measures following several reports of burglary overnight where the cars at the property are believed to have been the target. Thieves are targeting homes with vehicles, not always high value, that are parked at the address. After breaking into the house, they are searching for the car keys and then stealing the car. We have seen an increase in the number of incidents being reported over the last few weeks, and offences are occurring across the county. Officers are reminding residents to ensure their properties are left secure at all times and that items of value and keys are securely stored away out of view. 21.3.17	Off Road Bikers Reminded to be Lawful and Considerate Cont	We are reminding vehicle owners to be mindful and lawful when riding off road vehicles. As the weather improves and daylight hours increase, we receive calls from residents complaining about off road motor bikes, quad bikes and other illegal motor cycles. Riding off road bikes is enjoyed by lots of people, but they can only be ridden on private land and with the land owner's permission. Such bikes are noisy, and sometimes dangerous, and more often than not are likely to be uninsured. Riders are reminded to wear suitable protective clothing including helmets when riding these vehicles. Officers are reminding parents to ensure they know where their children are and what they are doing, and to make them aware of the potential danger of riding these vehicles.

		Do not be tempted to store valuable items inside your caravan as they can be easily stolen and expensive to replace.
		It is nice to be able to hook-up and get away quickly with your caravan but be alert to anyone hanging around your property for unknown reasons and ensure your caravan cannot be hooked-up quickly and driven off by anyone other than you.
7.4.17	Home Security Systems	We have been made aware of companies cold calling people selling alarm and security systems. Our advice would be to never purchase items from cold callers/door step traders or indeed over the phone. If you are considering purchasing a security system, our advice is always to contact either the National Security Inspectorate (NSI) on 0191 296324 www.nsi.org.uk , or the Security Systems and Alarm Inspection Board (SSAIB) on 01628 637512 www.ssaib.org.uk both organisations hold a register of approved installers. Your nearest approved supplier will be advised based on your postcode. An approved supplier can visit you at an agreed time to assess your needs and advise on the most suitable system.
10.4.17	Shed and Garage break- ins across Lichfield	Please report any suspicious callers or rogue traders to us on 101. We are urging residents to be extra vigilant and to review security on sheds, garages and outbuildings following a numbr of shed and garage break-ins over the weekend Saturday 8 and Sunday 9 April. We are reminding residents to ensure sheds, garages and outbuildings are secure at all times and secondary locking devices fitted to items of value stored within. High value mountain bikes have been stolen along with power tools and garden machinery. If you have any information, please contact us on 101 and ask to speak to the Lichfield local policing team.
