Responsibilities of each Council are as follows: Parish Council

Developing and maintenance of recreation facilities, open spaces, seats, bus shelters, commenting on local planning applications, providing Christmas lighting, grass cutting and hedge maintenance of Parish Council land, litter and dog bins.

District Council

Sports centres, leisure & recreation, arts & tourism, housing advice, housing & council tax benefits, local plans, planning & building control, environmental health, waste & recycling collections, street cleaning, licensing & inspection of food, taxis etc., off street parking & city car parks, collection of council tax & business rates.

County Council

Educational issues and youth service, adult & social care, public health, highways & transport, planning, community safety, trading standards, libraries, museums and art galleries, waste disposal, registration of births, marriages & deaths, economic development & tourism.

Local Planning Issues - The Regional Spatial Strategy

Deputy Prime Minister published the Regional Spatial Strategy (RSS) for the West Midlands. This is the Government's statement of its development strategies and it forms the basis of all local planning as LDC must comply with the RSS. It indicated that Lichfield District should provide 8300 homes by 2026 and as 3300 have already been built or planned for in the district a further 5000 should be built to comply with the RSS. In December 2007 Lichfield District Council produced its Issues and Option Document on how housing development and other planning considerations until 2026 might be addressed. yond 2026. The Parish Council has provided detailed responses at each iteration of this process. In June we also responded to LDC on the draft SHLAA (Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment) commenting on the parcels of land included in the document for possible housing sites within the Parish. These documents propose a number of options some of which, if taken forward, will have major implications for both Fradley and Streethay in terms of housing allocations, traffic and infrastructure.

LDC were due to publish the draft Core Strategy in October which was the penultimate stage of the process before the final docuwas adopted. However, in Sep-

Revision document states "With the 1.000 dwellings already envisaged at Fradley and 850 envisaged at Streethay, the effective increase in provision would enable consideration of the optimum means of securing the most sustainable form of development to the north-east of Lichfield for up to 4,000 dwellings within the plan period, be that as an urban extension or a new settlement (or indeed a combination)."

> LDC has postponed the issue of the draft Core Strategy document until it has had time to consider the implications of the RSS revision. Clearly this has major implications for the Parish and we will keep you and both local action groups informed and will advise when documents are available for consultation so that you can make representations to the relevant bodies.
